## Body Parts: Comprehensive Lesson Plans

### Week 1: Introduction to the Human Body

Day 1: Monday, January 5, 2026

#### Lesson Plan: Introduction to Body Parts

##### Learning Objectives:

- Identify and name major external body parts
- Understand the basic functions of external body parts
- Develop curiosity about the human body

##### Teaching Methodology/Strategy:

- Interactive lecture
- Group discussion
- Visual aids

##### Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
  - Welcome students and introduce the topic of body parts
  - Ask students to name five body parts they know
2. Main Lesson (20 minutes)
  - Present an overview of major external body parts using a large diagram or interactive whiteboard
  - Discuss the basic functions of each part (e.g., eyes for seeing, ears for hearing)
  - Engage students in a "Simon Says" game to reinforce learning
3. Group Activity (10 minutes)
  - Divide class into small groups
  - Each group creates a simple body part poster
4. Conclusion (5 minutes)
  - Recap key points
  - Preview next lesson on cells

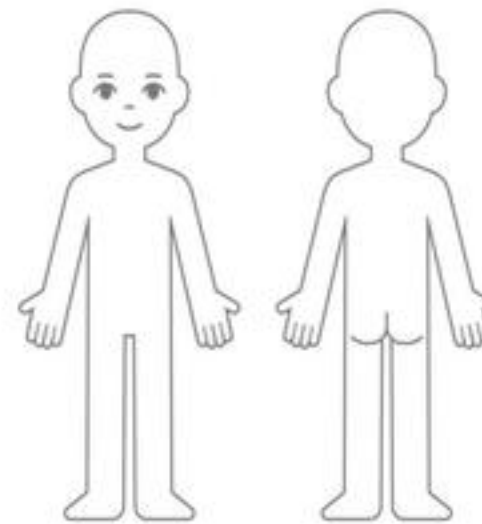

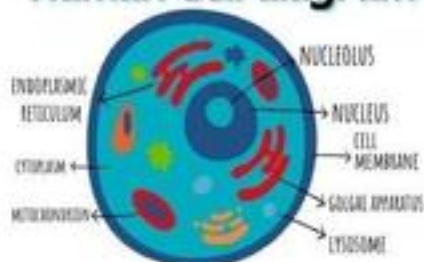


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## The Building Blocks: Cells

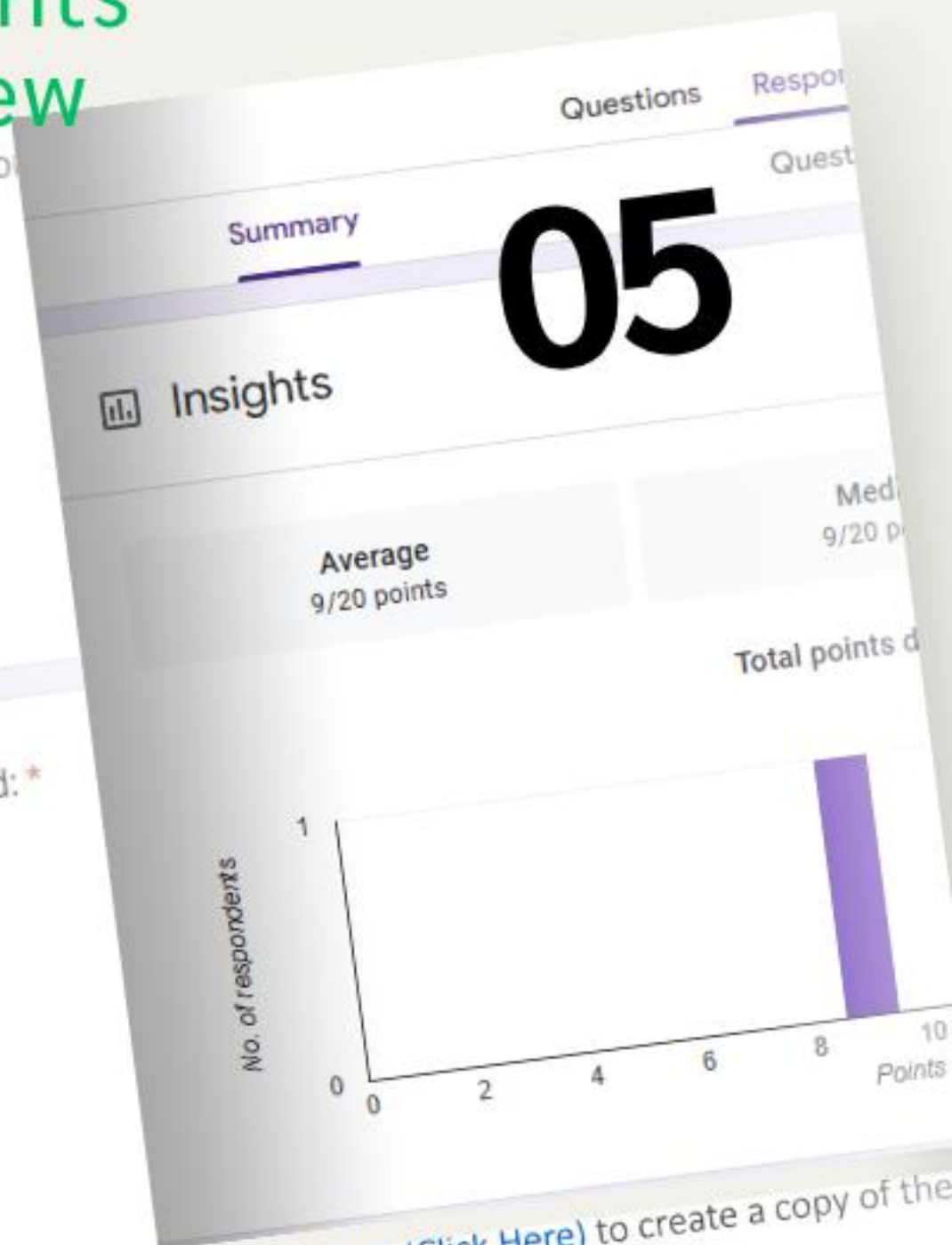

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### Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.  
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.  
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
