Week 1: Introduction to Compound Words

Lesson 1: What Are Compound Words?

Date: Monday, January 5, 2026

Week: 1

Duration: 40 minutes

Learning Objectives:

- Define compound words
- Identify compound words in everyday language
- Understand how compound words are formed

Teaching Methodology/Strategy:

- Direct instruction
- Interactive discussion
- Visual aids (presentation slides)

Lesson Planner & Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Begin with a warm-up activity: Ask students to name objects they see in the classroom
 - Highlight any compound words mentioned
2. Presentation (15 minutes)
 - Define compound words using Slide 2
 - Show examples of compound words
 - Discuss the three types of compound words (Slide 3)
3. Activity: Compound Word Detective (15 minutes)
 - Use Slide 4 to play the Compound Word Detective game
 - Have students identify compound words from the list

- Discuss the individual words that make up each compound

4. Conclusion and Homework Assignment (5 minutes)

- Recap the definition and types of compound words
- Assign homework: Students create a list of 10 compound words they use or see at home

Activities, Resources, Class Work:

- Compound Word Detective game (Slide 4)
- Classroom discussion
- Presentation slides

Home Work:

- Create a list of 10 compound words used or seen at home

Tips & Strategies for Teachers:

- Encourage students to share examples from their own experiences
- Use visual aids to reinforce the concept of joining words

- Struggling: Identify simple, common compound words in a list

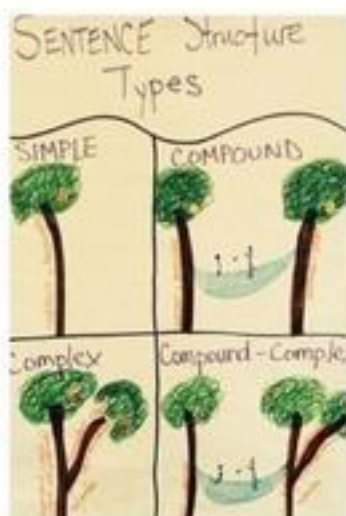


What Are Compound Words?

- Compound words are made by joining two or more words together
- They create a new word with a different meaning
- Examples: sunflower, playground, toothbrush
- Can you think of any compound words you use every day?



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Types of Compound Words

- Closed compounds: written as one word (e.g., butterfly)
- Open compounds: written as separate words (e.g., ice cream)
- Hyphenated compounds: joined by a hyphen (e.g., mother-in-law)
- Which type do you think is most common?

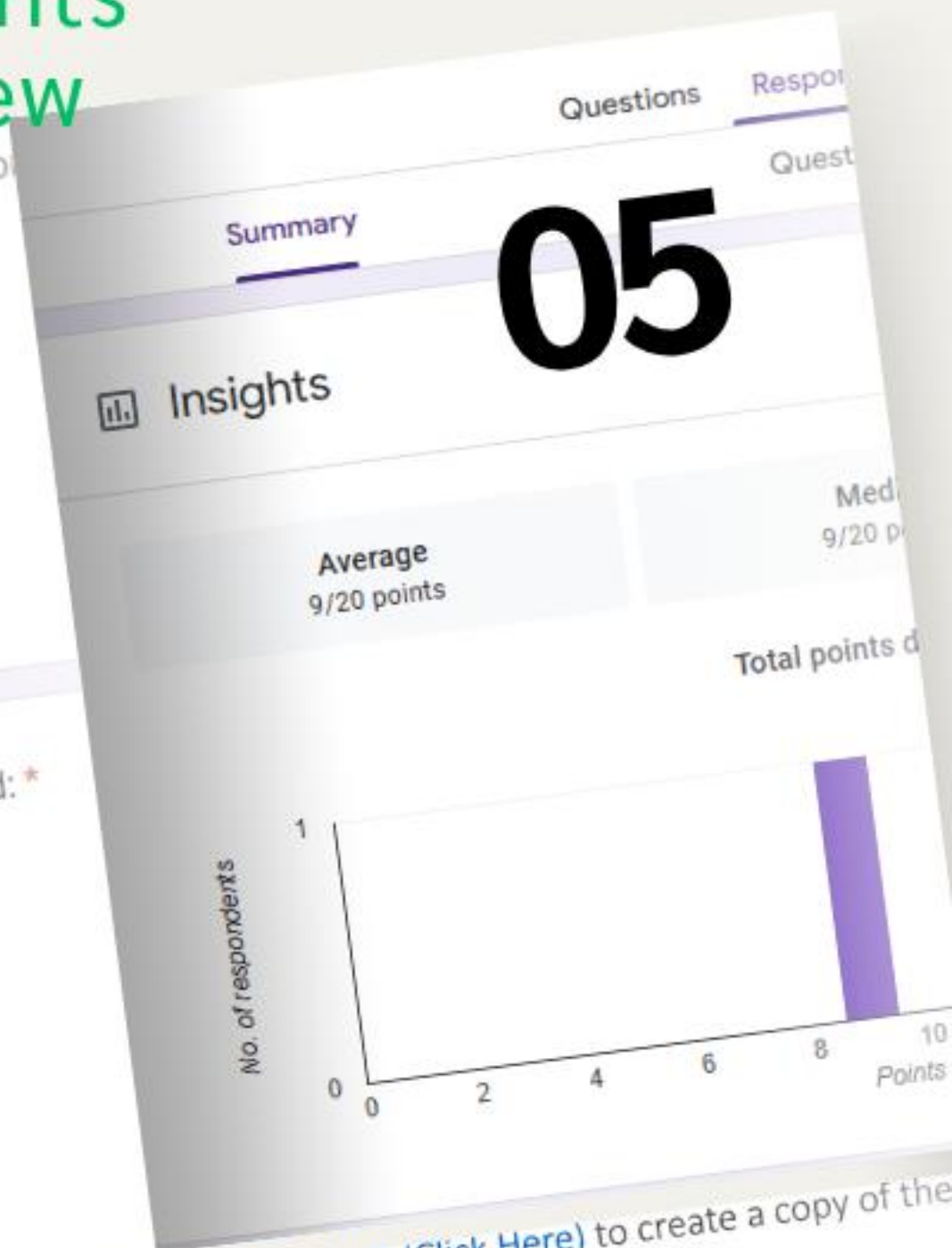

Q1: Define a declarative sentence and provide an example.

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express a strong feeling or emotion.
Example: "What a beautiful day!"

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command.
Example: "Close the door." While an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
Example: "Close the door now!"
