Week 1: Introduction to Decimals and Place Value

Lesson 1: What Are Decimals?

Date: Monday, January 5, 2026

Duration: 40 minutes

Learning Objectives:

- Define decimals and their purpose
- Identify decimals in real-life contexts
- Understand the basic structure of decimal numbers

Teaching Methodology:

- Direct instruction
- Class discussion
- Visual aids

Lesson Planner:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Ask students where they've seen decimals in everyday life
2. Direct Instruction (15 minutes)
 - Define decimals
 - Explain the decimal point and its significance
 - Show examples of decimals (0.5, 3.14, 7.25)
3. Class Activity (15 minutes)
 - "Decimal Scavenger Hunt" in the classroom
4. Wrap-up and Assignment (5 minutes)

Activities and Resources:

- Decimal number line poster
- Real-life objects with decimal measurements (rulers, measuring cups)

Homework:

- Find and list 5 examples of decimals used in everyday life

Tips for Teachers:

- Use relatable examples like money to introduce decimals
- Encourage students to share their own experiences with decimals

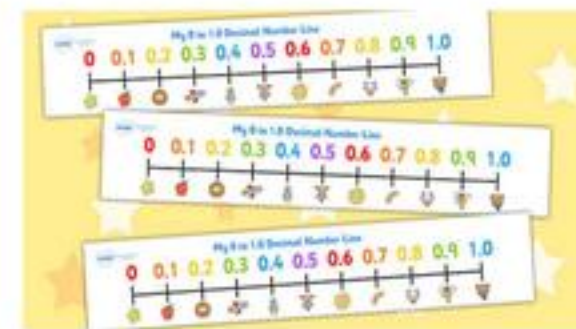

What Are Decimals?

- Decimals are numbers that fall between whole numbers
- They use a decimal point to show parts smaller than 1
- Examples: 0.5, 3.14, 7.25
- Can you think of places you've seen decimals in real life?



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Place Value in Decimals

- Tenths: First place to the right of the decimal point
- Hundredths: Second place to the right
- Thousandths: Third place to the right
- Let's practice: What's the value of 5 in 3.75?



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Reading and Writing Decimals

- Read the whole number part first
- Then say "and" for the decimal point
- Read the decimal part as if it's a whole number
- Finally, say the place value of the last digit
- Example: 5.23 is "five and twenty-three hundredths"

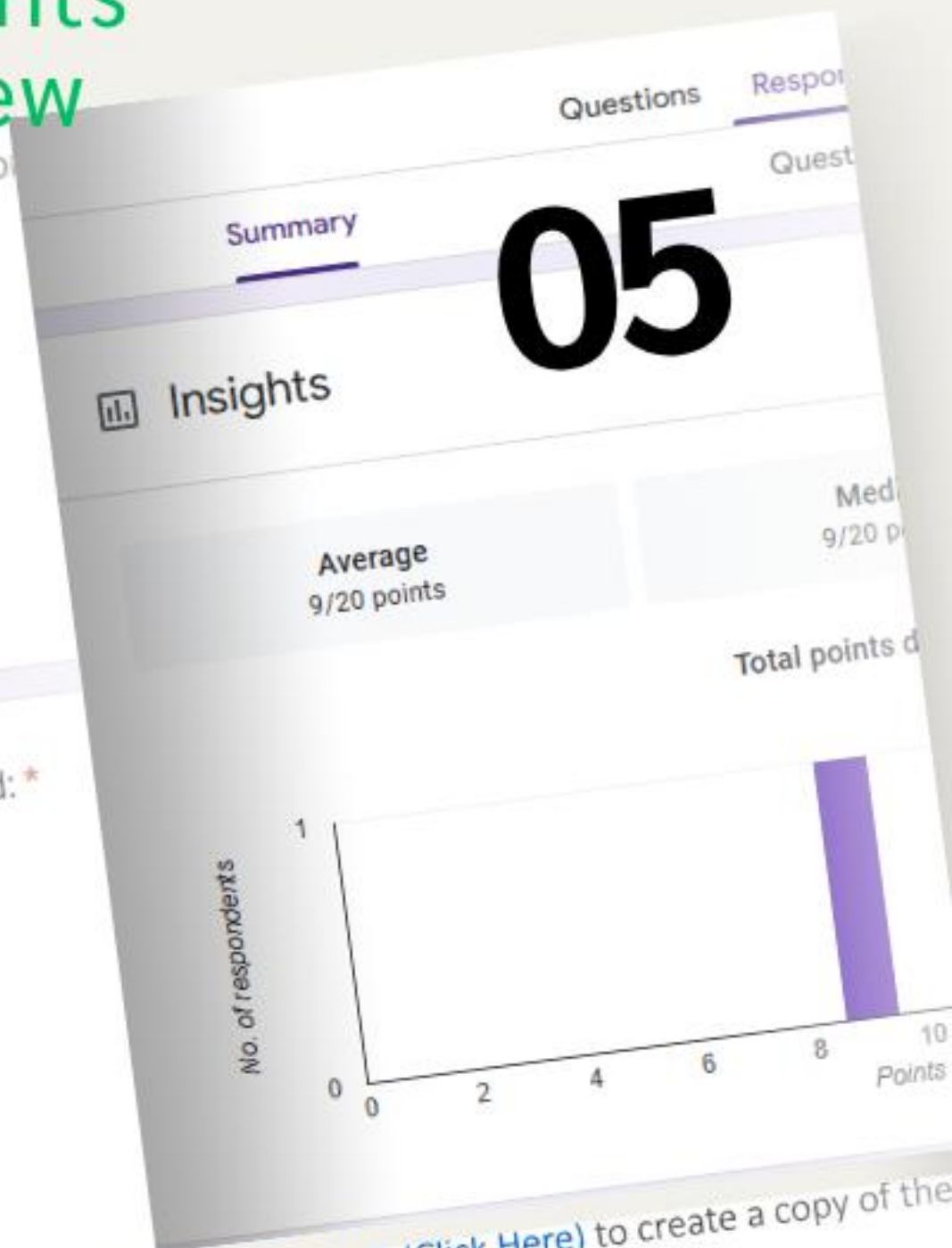

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command. An exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
