Day 1: Monday, January 5, 2026

Lesson Plan: Introduction to Figurative Language

Learning Objectives:

- Define figurative language
- Understand the purpose of figurative language in writing
- Identify the five main types of figurative language

Teaching Methodology/Strategy:

- Direct instruction
- Class discussion
- Interactive examples

Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Engage students with a fun example of figurative language
 - Explain the lesson objectives
2. Define Figurative Language (10 minutes)
 - Present the definition of figurative language
 - Discuss how it differs from literal language
3. Purpose of Figurative Language (10 minutes)
 - Explain why writers use figurative language
 - Class discussion: How does figurative language make writing more interesting?
4. Types of Figurative Language (15 minutes)
 - Introduce the five main types: similes, metaphors, personification, hyperbole, and idioms
 - Provide a brief example of each

Activities:

- Class Work: In pairs, students brainstorm examples of figurative language they've heard or read
- Home Work: Find three examples of figurative language in a book, song, or advertisement

Tips for Teachers:

- Use engaging, age-appropriate examples to capture students' interest
- Encourage students to share their own experiences with figurative language

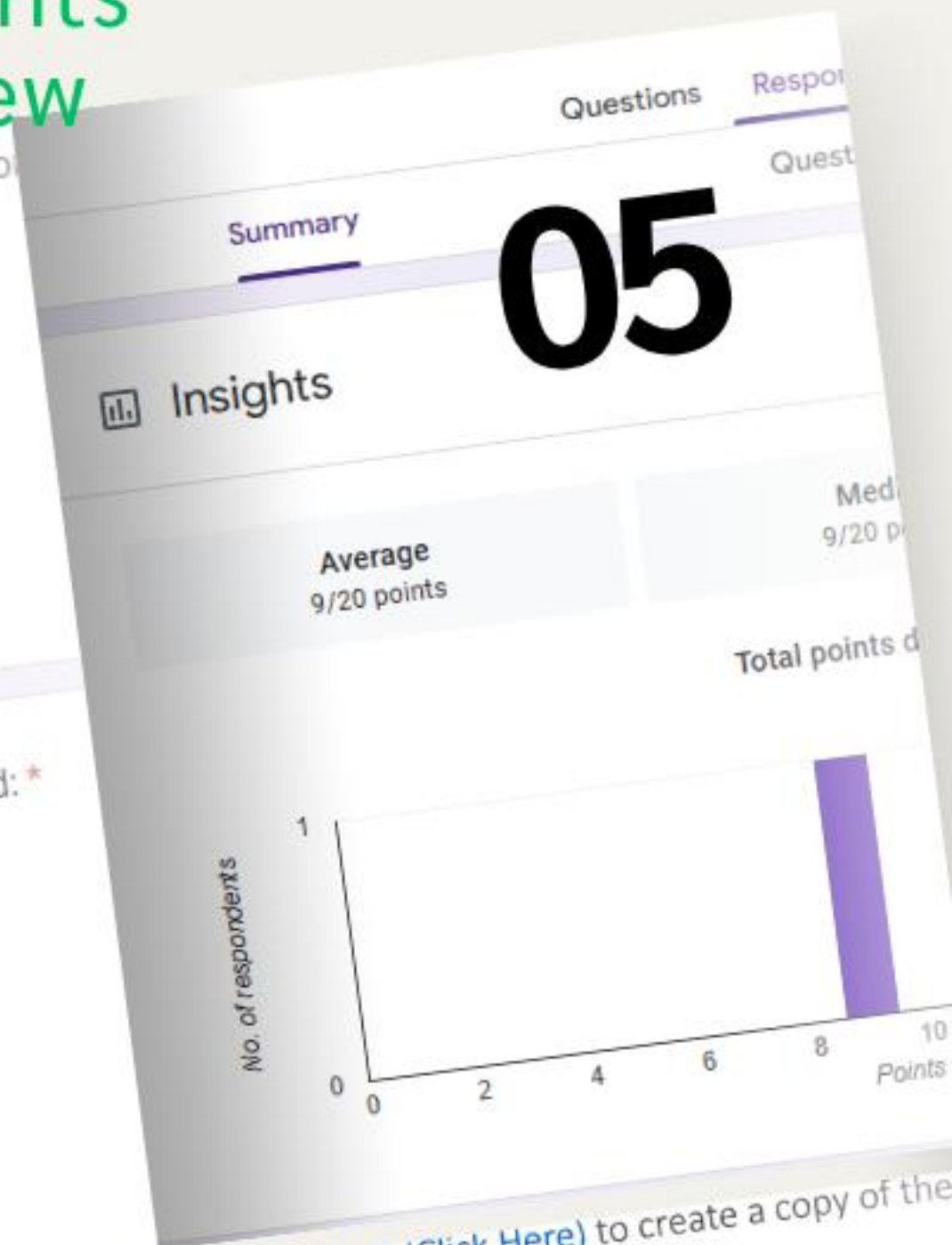

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
