Week 1: Introduction to the Five Senses

Day 1: Monday, January 5, 2026

Lesson Plan: Introduction to the Five Senses

Learning Objectives:

- Identify and name the five senses
- Understand the basic function of each sense

Teaching Methodology:

- Interactive presentation
- Group discussion
- Hands-on activities

Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Welcome students and introduce the topic of the five senses
 - Show Slides 1 and 2 of the presentation
2. Brainstorming Activity (10 minutes)
 - Ask students to name the five senses
 - Write their responses on the board
 - Show Slide 3 to confirm the five senses
3. Sense Exploration (20 minutes)
 - Divide the class into five groups, each representing one sense
 - Provide each group with a set of objects related to their sense
 - Groups explore their objects and discuss how they relate to their sense
4. Group Presentations (5 minutes)
 - Each group briefly shares their findings with the class

Activities:

- "Guess the Sense" game: Teacher describes an action, students guess which sense it primarily uses

Homework:

- Students create a simple "senses journal" to record observations using their senses over the next week

Tips for Teachers:

- Encourage students to use descriptive language when discussing their senses
- Be prepared with alternative explanations for students who may have sensory impairments

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What Are the Five Senses?

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Sense #1: Sight - Your Window to the World

- Your eyes are like cameras, capturing images of everything around you
- Sight helps you recognise colours, shapes, and movements

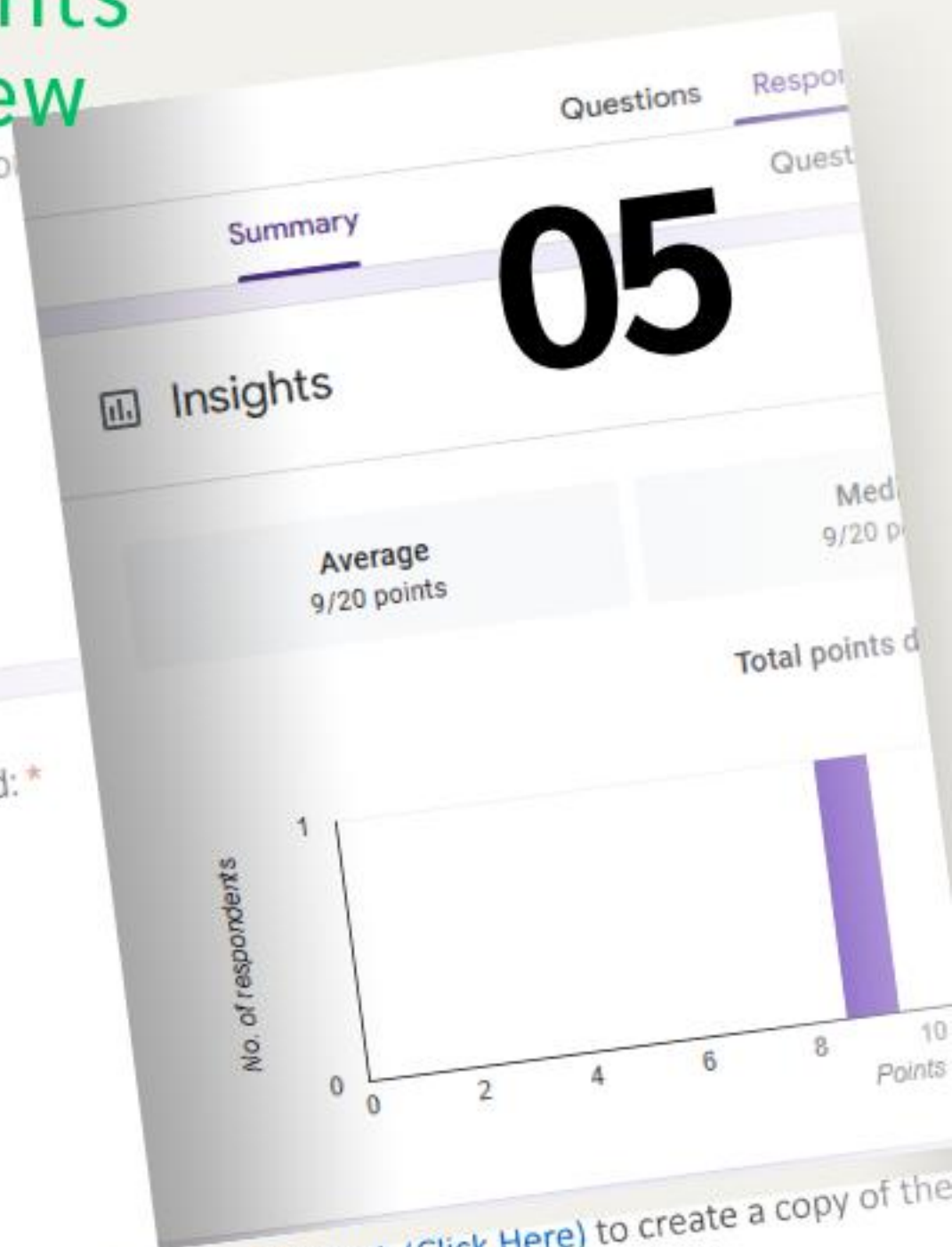

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
