Week 1: Introduction to Johnny Appleseed

Lesson 1: Who Was Johnny Appleseed?

Date: Monday, September 7, 2026

Month: September

Week: 1

Learning Objectives:

- Identify who Johnny Appleseed was and his real name
- Describe the basic facts about Johnny Appleseed's life
- Explain why he was called "Johnny Appleseed"

Teaching Methodology/Strategy:

- Direct instruction
- Class discussion
- Visual aids (timeline, map)

Lesson Planner & Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes):

- Ask students what they know about Johnny Appleseed
- Show a picture of Johnny Appleseed (as depicted in folklore)

2. Direct Instruction (15 minutes):

- Present basic facts about Johnny Appleseed:
 - Real name: John Chapman
 - Born in 1774 in Massachusetts
 - Known for planting apple trees across the American frontier
 - Explain the origin of his nickname

3. Class Discussion (10 minutes):

- Why do you think he's called "Johnny Appleseed"?
- What do you imagine life was like on the American frontier?

4. Timeline Activity (10 minutes):

- Create a simple timeline of Johnny Appleseed's life on the board
- Have students copy the timeline in their notebooks

Activities, Resources, Class Work, Home Work:

- Class Work: Create a "fact sheet" about Johnny Appleseed
- Homework: Write a short paragraph explaining why Johnny Appleseed is an important historical figure

Tips & Strategies for teachers:

- Use visual aids to help students understand the time period
- Encourage students to think critically about why Johnny Appleseed's story became popular

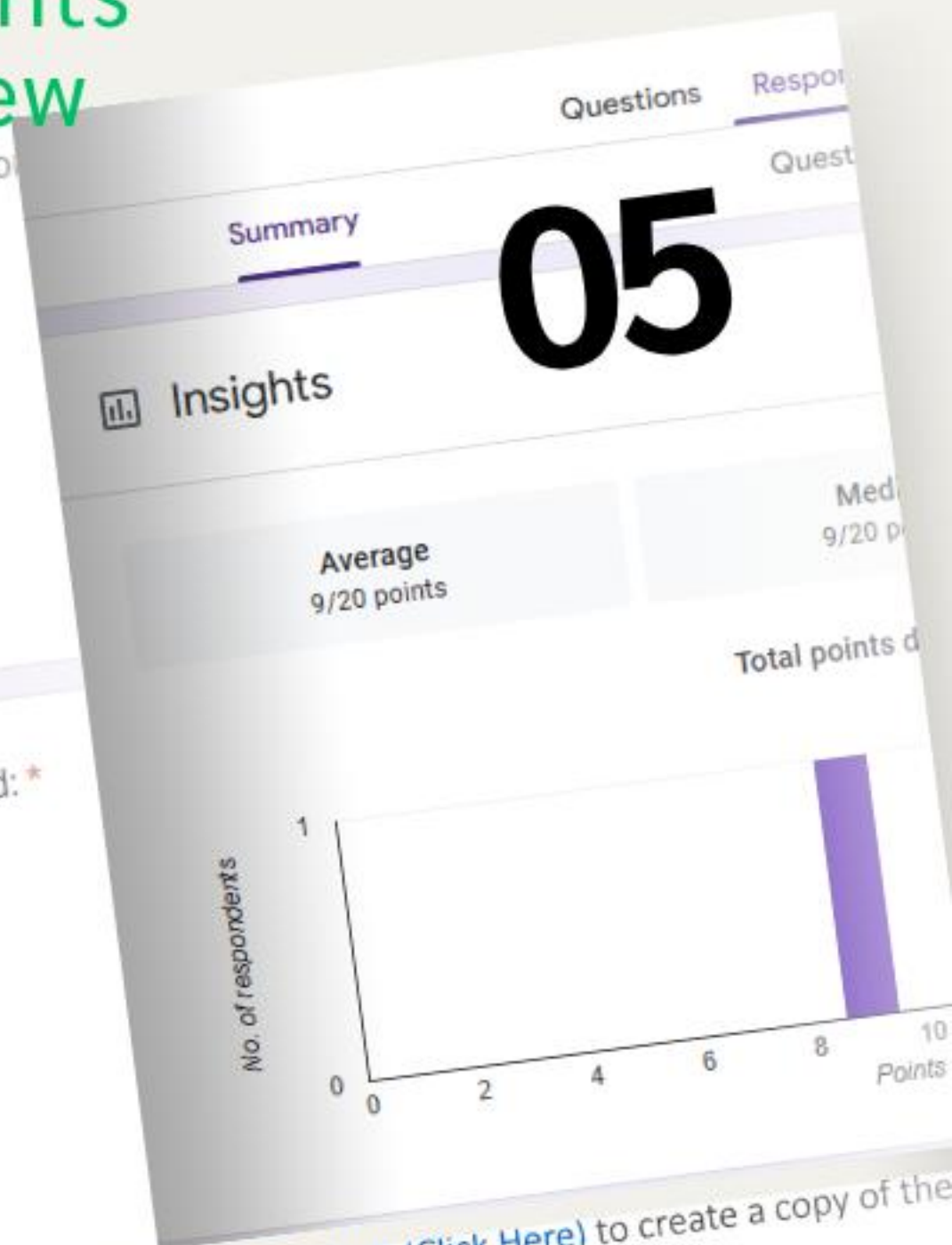

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command. An exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
