Solar System Unit Plan

Week 1

Day 1: Monday, January 5, 2026

Lesson 1: Introduction to Our Solar System

Learning Objectives:

- Describe the basic structure of our solar system
- Identify the main components of our solar system
- Explain the role of the Sun in our solar system

Teaching Methodology/Strategy:

- Interactive lecture
- Think-Pair-Share
- Visual aids (posters, digital images)

Lesson Planner & Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Engage students with a brief video clip of the solar system
2. Interactive lecture on solar system basics (15 minutes)
3. Think-Pair-Share activity (10 minutes)
 - Students share what they know about the solar system with a partner
4. Class discussion on key points (5 minutes)
5. Wrap-up and homework assignment (5 minutes)

Activities, Resources, Class Work, Home Work:

- Class Work: Create a simple diagram of the solar system
- Homework: Research and write three interesting facts about the Sun

Tips & Strategies for teachers:

- Use a variety of visual aids to help students grasp the scale of the solar system
- Encourage students to ask questions and share their prior knowledge

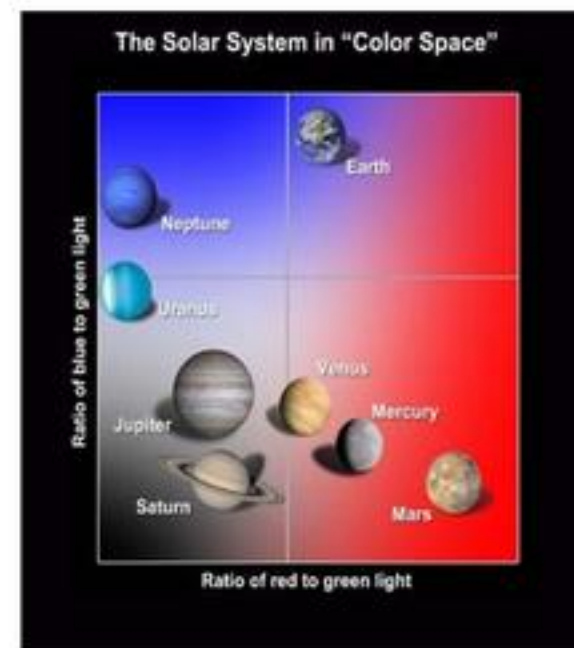

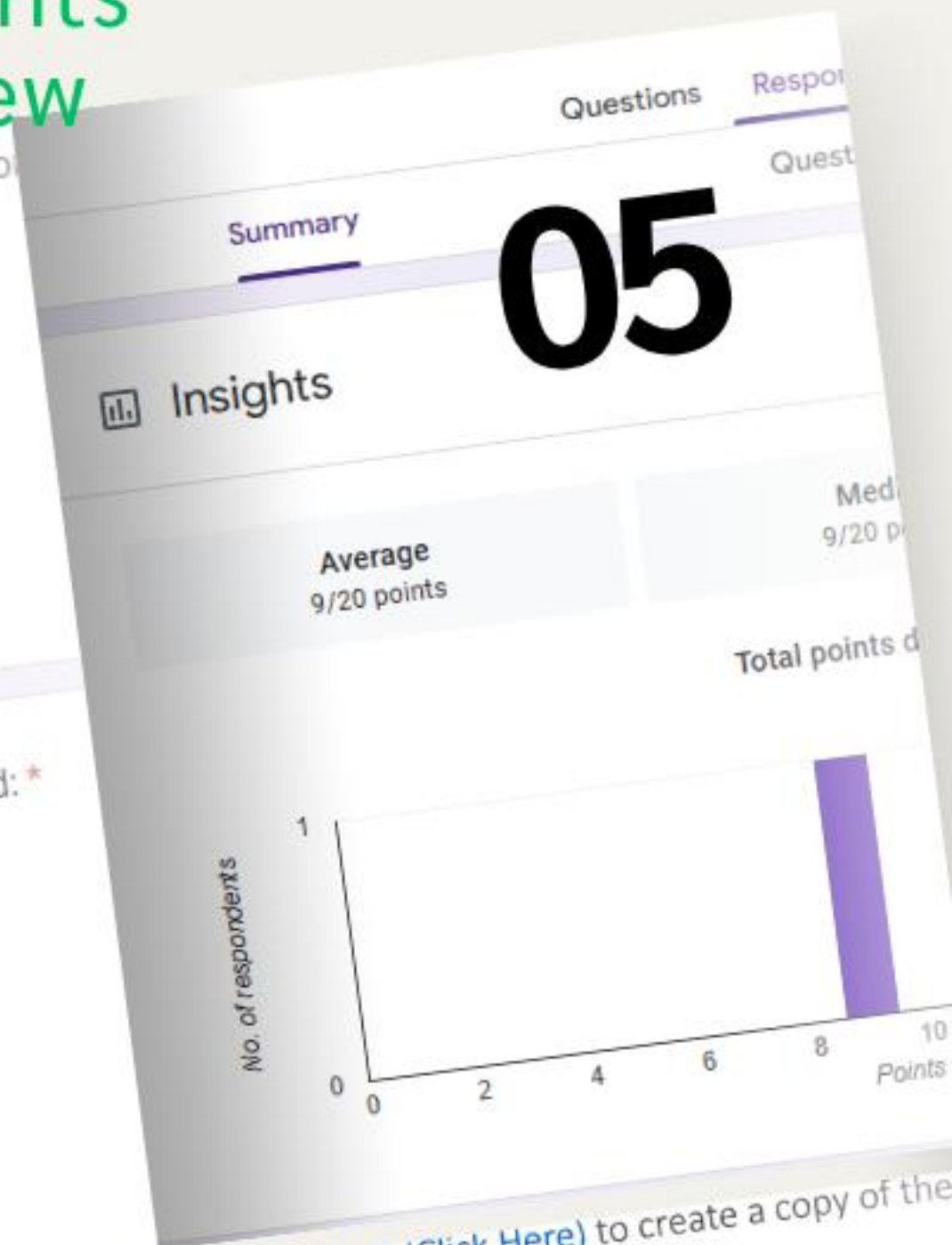

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
