## Veterans Day Lesson Plans

### Week 1: Introduction to Veterans Day

#### Lesson 1: What is Veterans Day?

**Date:** Monday, November 2, 2026  
**Duration:** 40 minutes

##### Learning Objectives:

- Define Veterans Day and its significance
- Explain the difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day
- Identify the date Veterans Day is observed

##### Teaching Methodology/Strategy:

- Direct instruction
- Class discussion
- Think-pair-share

##### Lesson Planner & Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
  - Ask students what they know about Veterans Day
  - Show a brief video clip about Veterans Day
2. Direct Instruction (15 minutes)
  - Explain the definition of Veterans Day
  - Discuss its history and why it's observed on November 11th
  - Clarify the difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day
3. Think-Pair-Share Activity (15 minutes)
  - Students think about why it's important to honor veterans
  - Pair up and share their thoughts
  - Volunteer pairs share with the class
4. Conclusion (5 minutes)

- Recap key points
- Preview next lesson on the history of Veterans Day

- Homework: Write a paragraph on why Veterans Day is important

## What is Veterans Day?

- Veterans Day is a federal holiday in the United States
- Observed annually on November 11th
- Honors military veterans who served in the U.S. Armed Forces
- Originally called Armistice Day, marking the end of World War I
- How do you think we can show appreciation for veterans?



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## History of Veterans Day



- November 11, 1918: World War I ended
- 1919: President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as Armistice Day
- 1954: Name changed to Veterans Day to honor all U.S. veterans
- Why do you think it's important to remember this history?



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## Who is a Veteran?

- A person who served in the U.S. Armed Forces
- Includes Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard
- Both wartime and peacetime service counts
- Veterans come from all walks of life and backgrounds

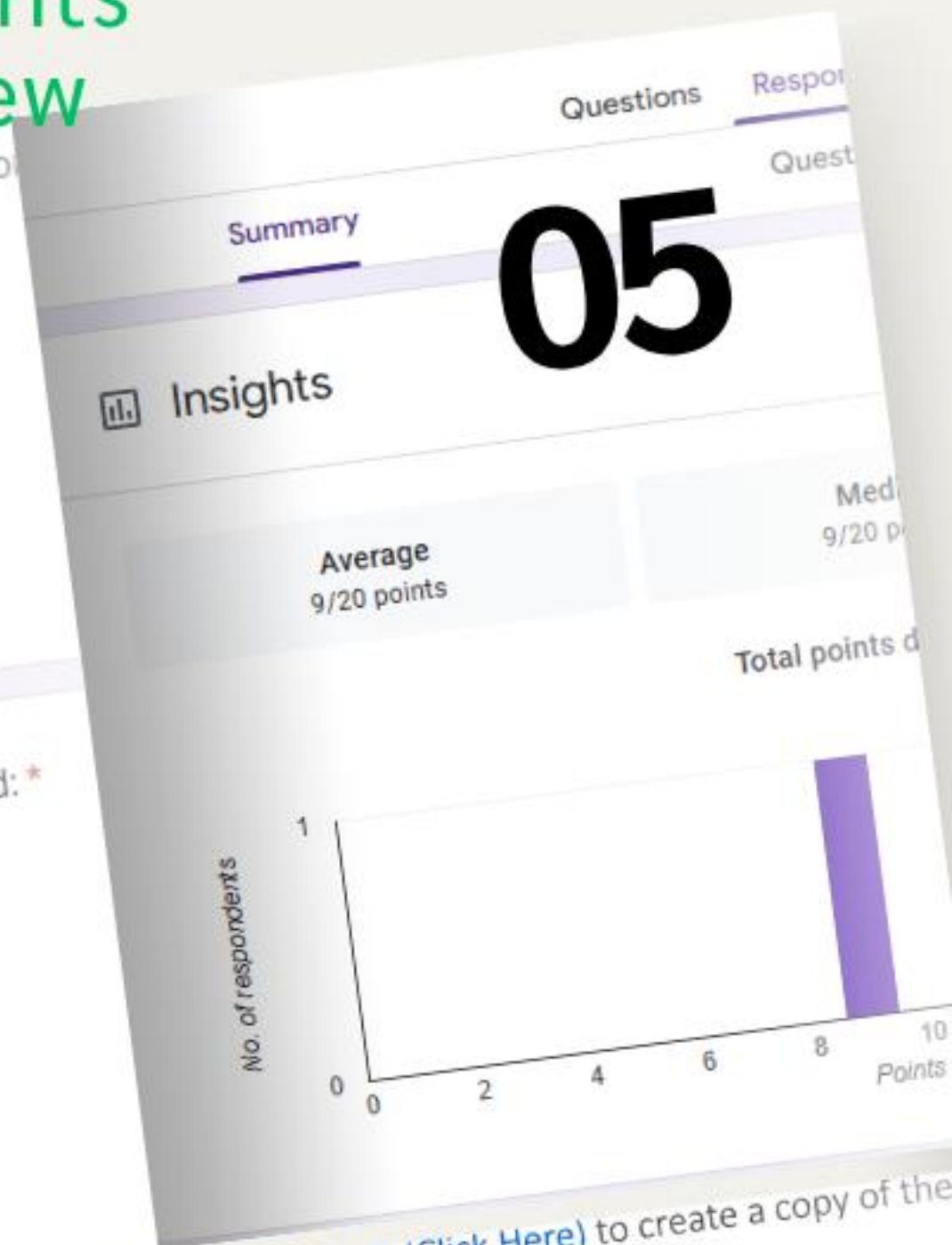

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### Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.  
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.  
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command. An exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
