Affirmation Station: Comprehensive Lesson Plans

Week 1: Introduction to Affirmations

Day 1: Monday, January 5, 2026

Learning Objectives:

- Define affirmations and their purpose
- Understand the power of positive thinking
- Create simple personal affirmations

Lesson Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Welcome students to the "Affirmation Station" unit
 - Briefly explain the concept of affirmations
2. Engage (10 minutes)
 - Ask students to share positive statements about themselves
 - Discuss how these statements make them feel
3. Explore (15 minutes)
 - Present examples of affirmations from Slide 6
 - Have students identify common themes in these affirmations
4. Explain (15 minutes)
 - Define affirmations using information from Slide 3
 - Discuss the power of positive thinking (Slide 4)
5. Elaborate (20 minutes)
 - Guide students in creating their own affirmations (Slide 5)
 - Share and discuss in small groups
6. Evaluate (15 minutes)

- Have students write a short reflection on their experience creating affirmations

Homework:

- Write three personal affirmations and practice saying them in the mirror

Tips for Teachers:

- Create a positive, supportive atmosphere in the classroom
- Encourage all students to participate, but don't force anyone who's uncomfortable

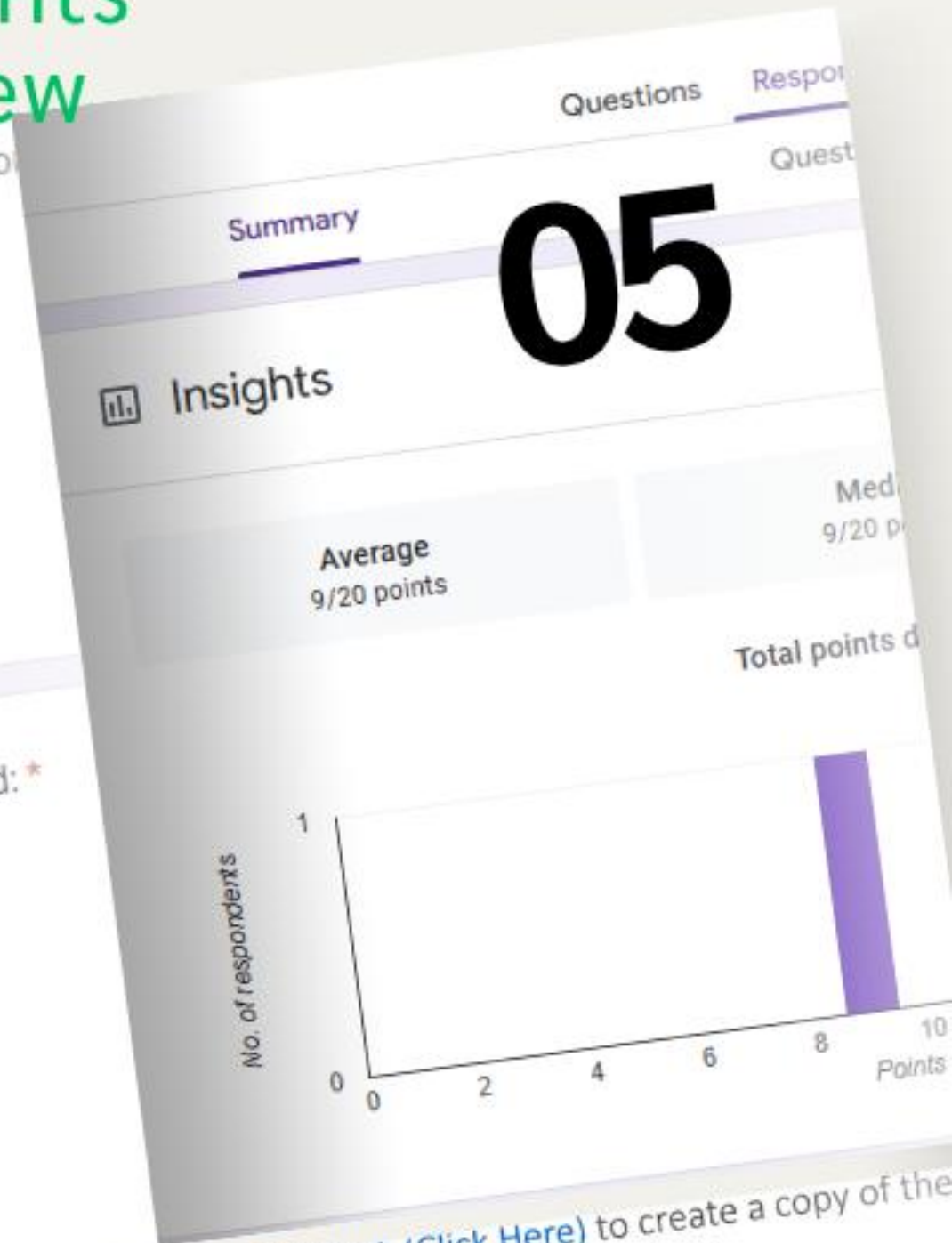

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
