Week 1 (January 5-9, 2026)

Lesson 1: Introduction to Nouns

Date: Monday, January 5, 2026

Learning Objectives:

- Define what a noun is
- Identify nouns in sentences and texts
- Understand the basic function of nouns in language

Teaching Methodology:

- Direct instruction
- Guided practice
- Interactive activities

Lesson Planner & Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)

- Ask students to name 3 things they see in the classroom
- Explain that these words are nouns

2. Direct Instruction (10 minutes)

- Define nouns: words that name people, places, things, or ideas
- Provide examples: teacher, school, pencil, happiness

3. Guided Practice (15 minutes)

- Display a picture and ask students to identify 5 nouns
- Write sentences on the board and have students circle the nouns

4. Interactive Activity (10 minutes)

- Play "I Spy" game using nouns in the classroom

Activities and Resources:

- Picture for noun identification
- Whiteboard and markers
- "I Spy" game cards

Class Work:

- Worksheet: Circle the nouns in given sentences

Home Work:

- List 10 nouns you see at home

Tips for Teachers:

- Use visual aids to help students understand the concept
- Encourage students to share their own examples

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Nouns: The Basics

- Nouns are words that name people, places, things, or ideas
- They're the "naming words" in our language
- Examples: teacher, school, pencil, happiness

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Common Nouns: The Everyday Heroes

- Common nouns name general people, places, or things
- They don't need capital letters (unless at the start of a sentence)
- Examples: dog, city, book, friend

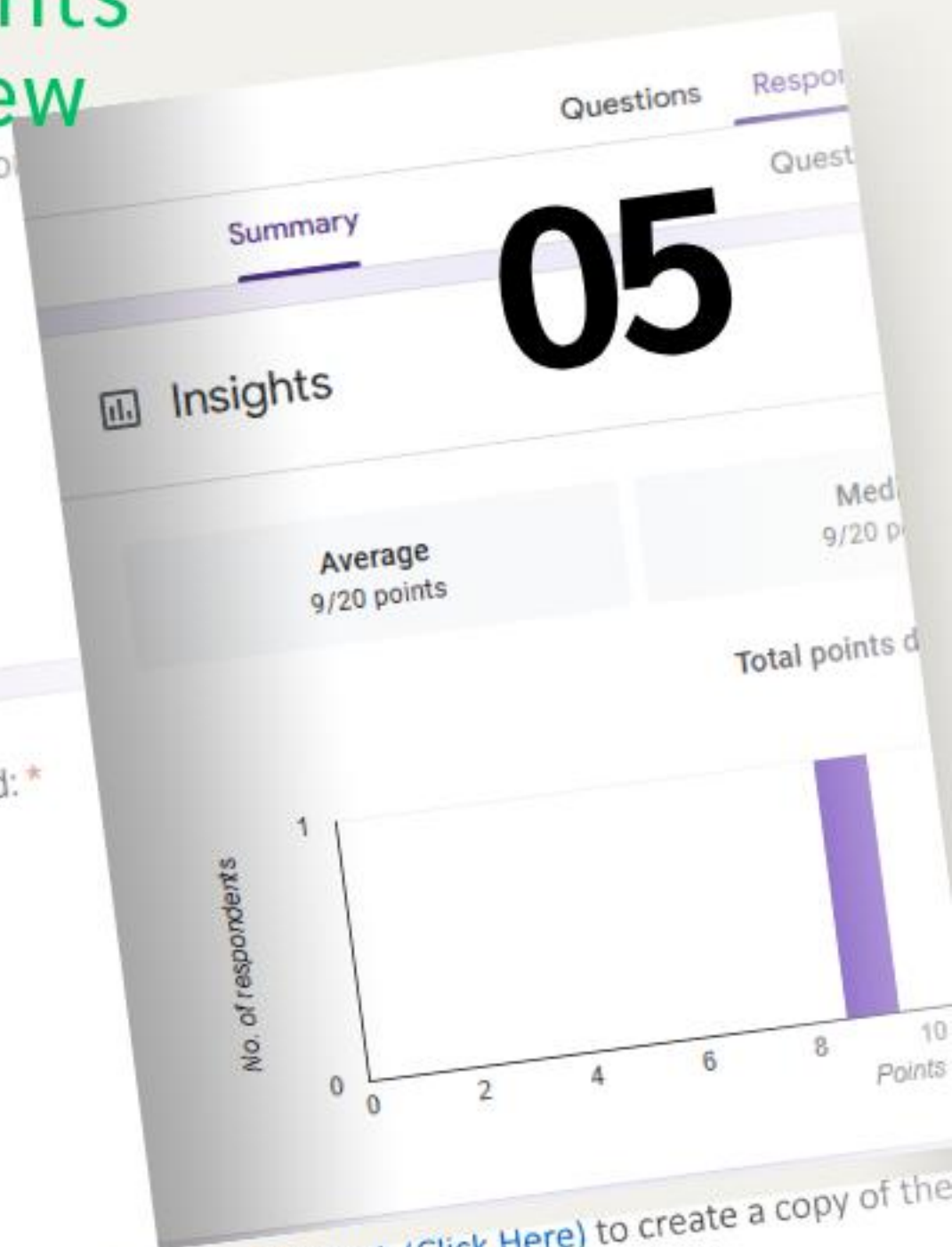

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.

What is the main purpose of an exclamatory sentence?
