Week 1: Introduction to Continents and Oceans

Lesson 1: What are Continents and Oceans?

Date: Monday, January 5, 2026

Duration: 40 minutes

Learning Objectives:

- Define continents and oceans
- Identify the 7 continents and 5 oceans of the world
- Understand the basic characteristics of continents and oceans

Teaching Methodology:

- Direct instruction
- Visual aids (world map)
- Group discussion

Lesson Planner:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Engage students with a quick "What do you know?" game about continents and oceans
2. Direct Instruction (15 minutes)
 - Define continents and oceans
 - Introduce the 7 continents and 5 oceans using a world map
3. Group Activity (15 minutes)
 - In small groups, students create a simple mnemonic to remember the names of continents and oceans
4. Wrap-up (5 minutes)
 - Share mnemonics and review key points

Activities and Resources:

- World map (digital or physical)

- Blank outline maps for students

Homework:

- Label the continents and oceans on a blank world map

- Use colorful visuals to make the lesson more engaging
- Encourage students to share personal experiences related to different continents or oceans

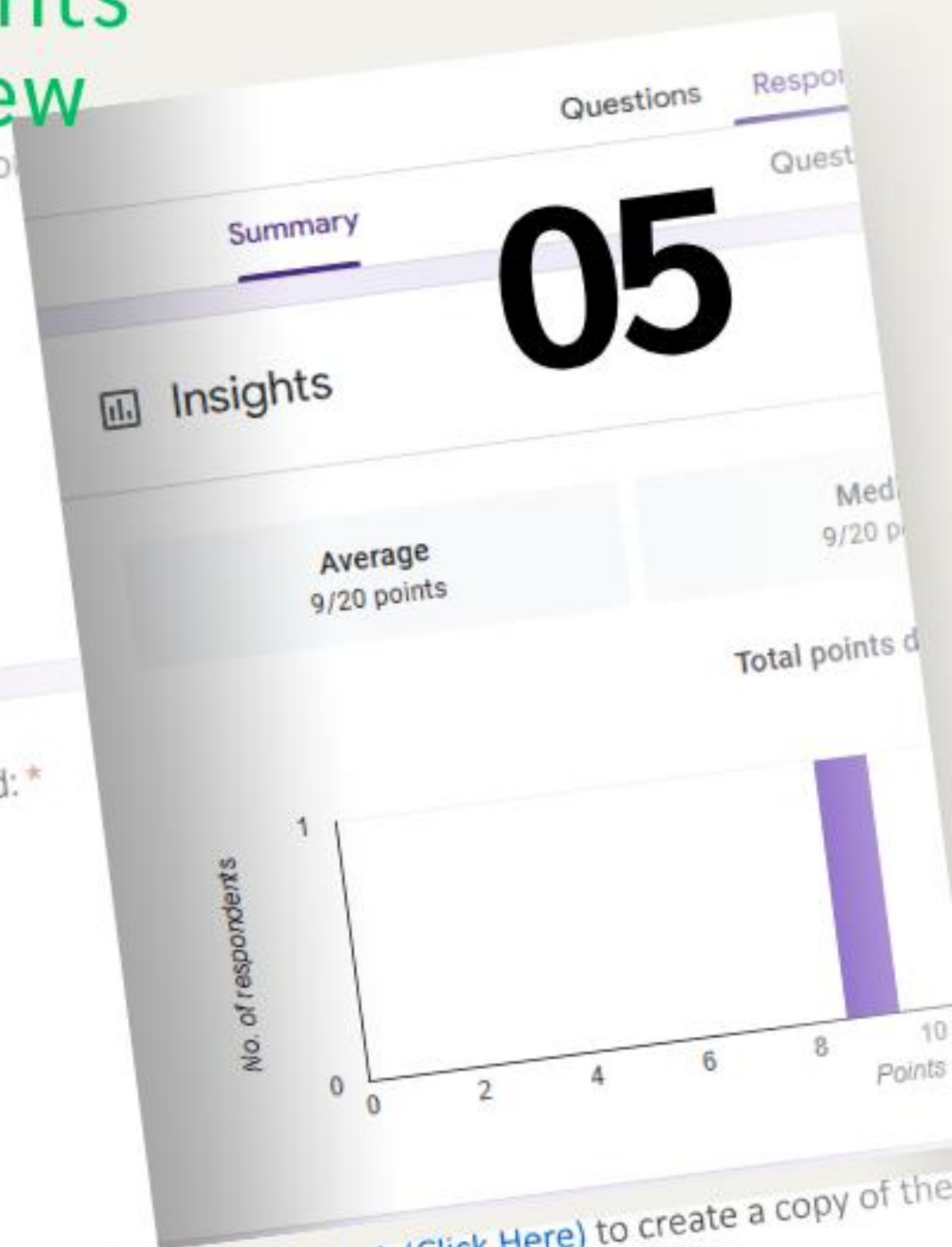

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express a strong feeling or emotion.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command. An exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
