Fire Safety Curriculum Overview

Week 1

Day 1: Monday, January 5, 2026

Lesson 1: Introduction to Fire Safety

Learning Objectives:

- Define fire safety and explain its importance
- Identify the three elements of the fire triangle
- List common causes of fires

Teaching Methodology/Strategy:

- Interactive lecture
- Class discussion
- Visual aids (whiteboard diagrams)

Lesson Planner & Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Welcome students and introduce the topic of fire safety
2. Define fire safety (10 minutes)
 - Explain what fire safety means
 - Discuss why it's important in daily life
3. The Fire Triangle (15 minutes)
 - Introduce the concept of the fire triangle
 - Explain each element: heat, fuel, and oxygen
 - Brainstorm examples of each element found in homes
4. Common Causes of Fires (8 minutes)
 - Present and discuss common fire causes
5. Conclusion and homework assignment (2 minutes)

Activities, Resources, Class Work:

- Class discussion: "Why is fire safety important?"
- Whiteboard activity: Drawing the fire triangle

Home Work:

- Create a list of potential fire hazards in your home

Tips & Strategies for teachers:

- Use real-life examples to make the content relatable
- Encourage students to share their experiences and knowledge

- Advanced: Explain how removing one element of the fire triangle extinguishes a fire
- Support: Identify at least two common causes of fires

- Explain: Present the fire triangle concept

- Use an interactive whiteboard to draw and label the fire triangle

- How might understanding the fire triangle help prevent fires?

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The Fire Triangle



- Fire needs three things to burn: heat, fuel, and oxygen
- This is called the fire triangle
- Can you think of examples of each element in your home?

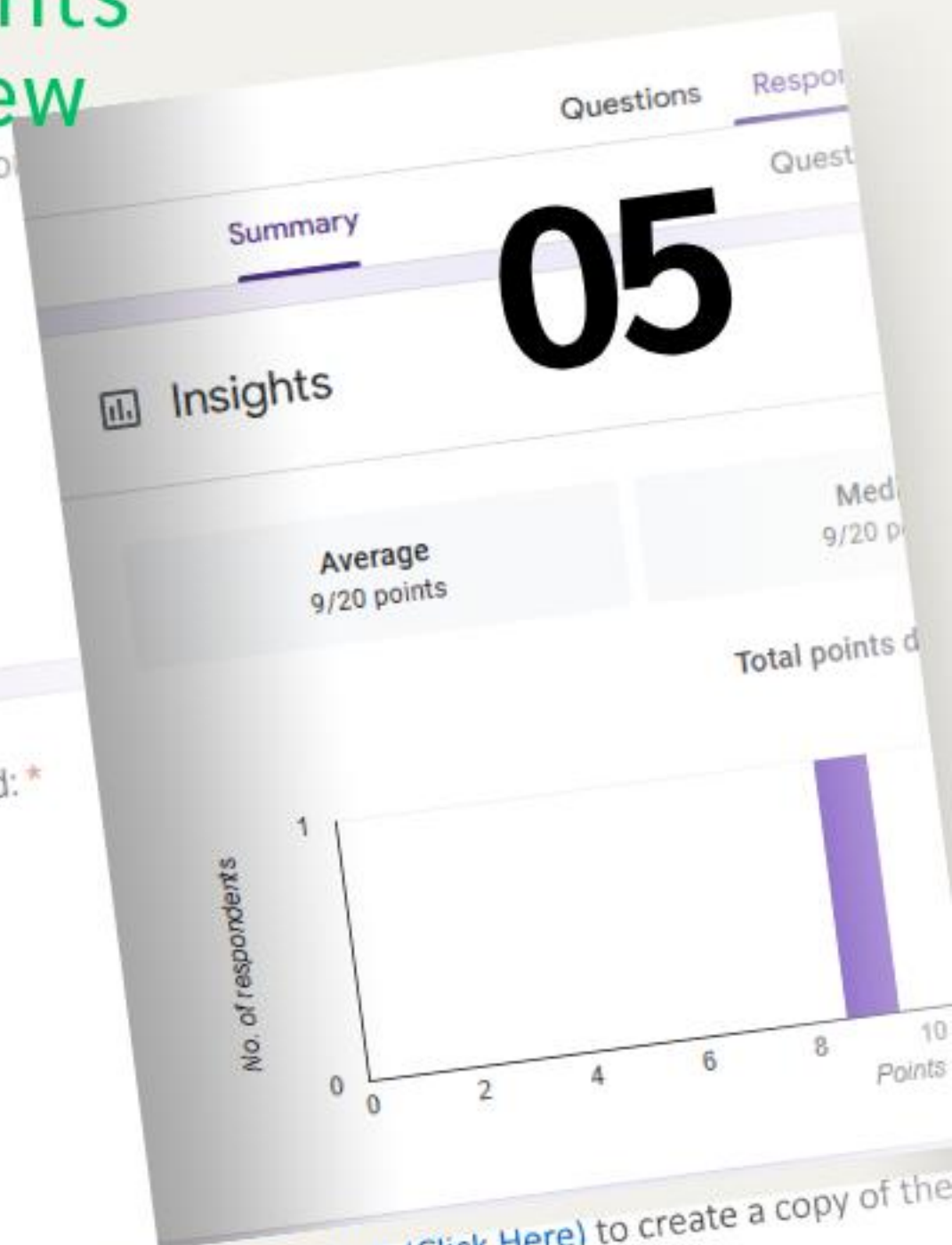

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
