Halloween Math Lesson Plans

Week 1: Introduction to Halloween Math

Lesson 1: Spooky Counting and Multiplication

Date: Monday, October 5, 2026

Month: October

Week: Week 1

Learning Objectives:

- Students will be able to count and multiply using Halloween-themed objects.
- Students will understand the concept of multiplication as repeated addition.

Teaching Methodology/Strategy:

- Direct instruction

1. Introduction (5 minutes):

4. Wrap-up and Assessment (5 minutes):

- Quick quiz on multiplication facts
- Assign homework

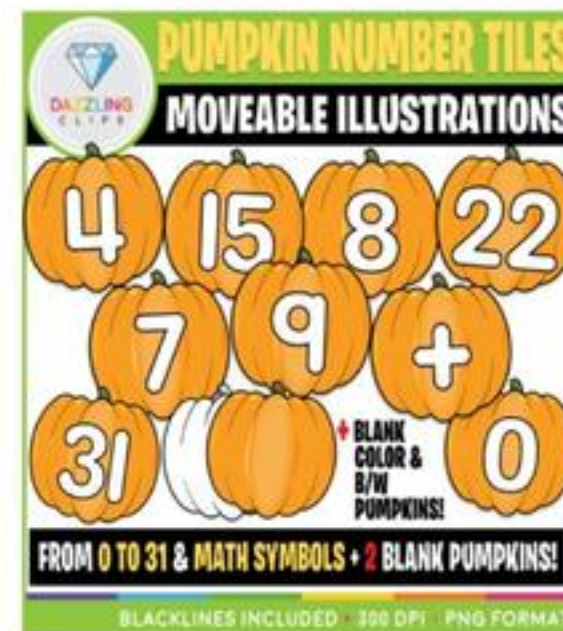

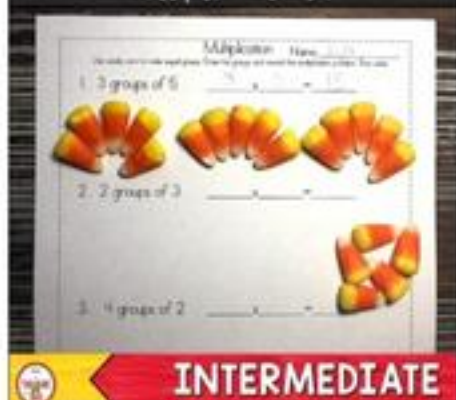
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Counting Candy Corn

CANDY CORN MATH

Multiple Activities



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- Imagine you have 3 bags of candy corn with 25 pieces each
- How many pieces do you have in total?
- Let's use multiplication: $3 \times 25 = 75$ pieces
- How many pieces would you have with 5 bags?



Pumpkin Perimeter

- A square pumpkin patch has sides of 10 feet each
- What's the perimeter of the patch?
- Remember: Perimeter = Sum of all sides
- So, $10 + 10 + 10 + 10 = 40$ feet
- What if the patch was a rectangle with length 12 feet and width 8 feet?

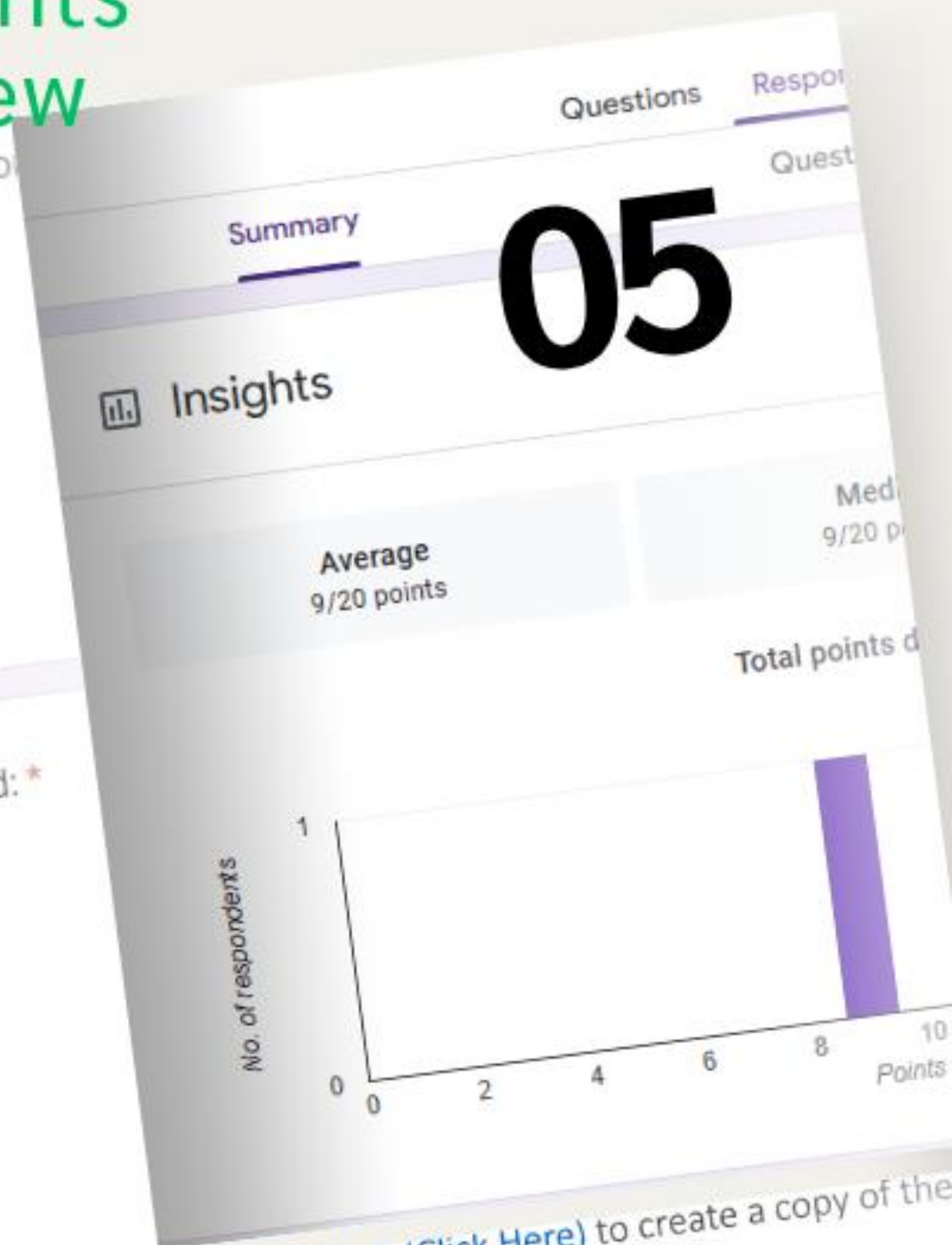

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
