Pumpkin Life Cycle: Comprehensive Lesson Plans

Week 1: Introduction to Pumpkins and Their Life Cycle

Lesson 1: Introduction to Pumpkins

Date: Monday, September 14, 2026

Duration: 40 minutes

Learning Objectives:

- Introduce students to pumpkins and their importance

- Ask students to find and bring an interesting pumpkin fact to the next class

- Bring a real pumpkin to class if possible for a hands-on experience
- Use vivid imagery to capture students' attention

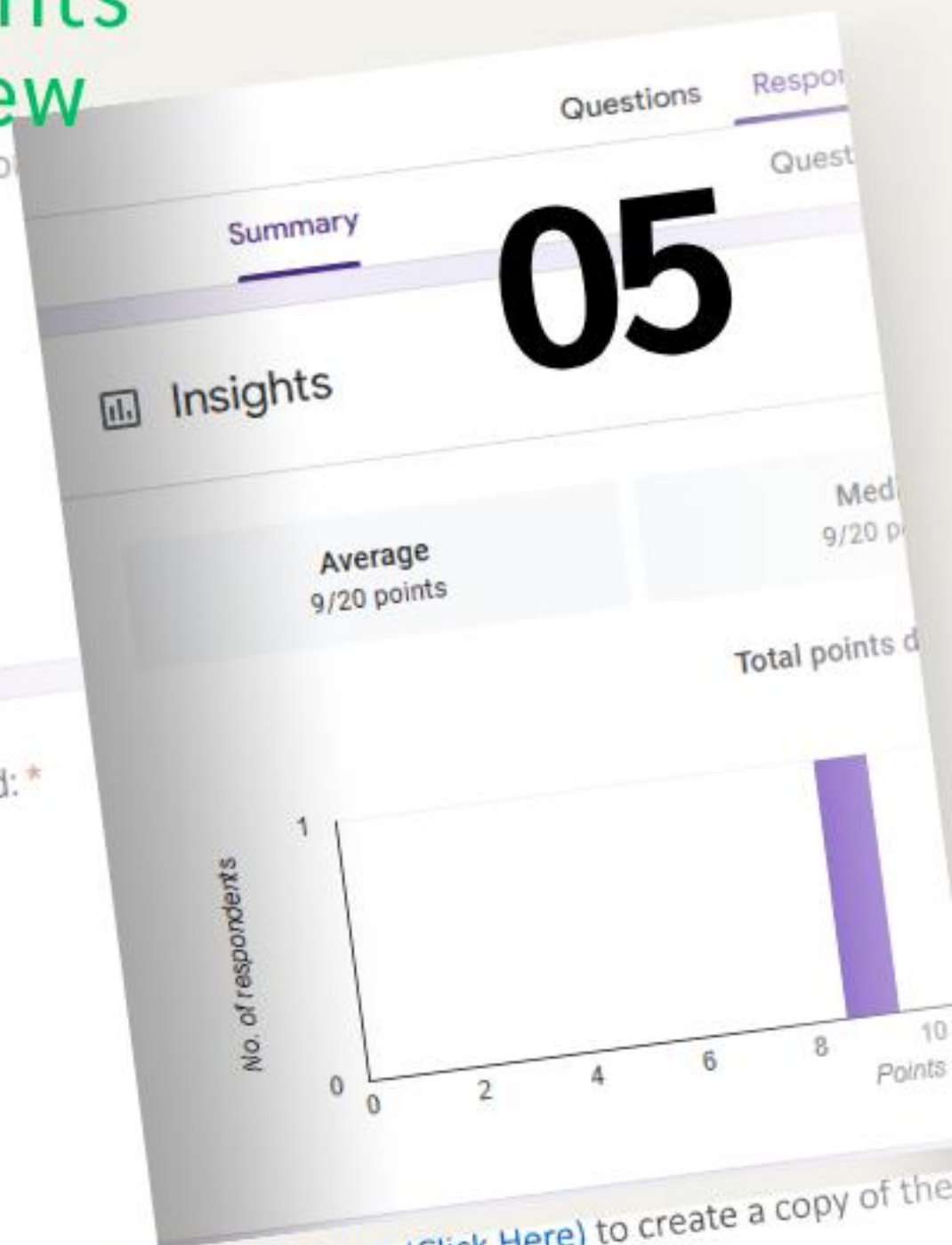

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command. An exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
