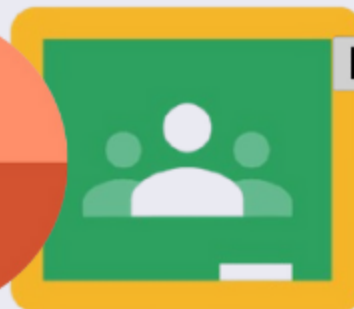

Week 1: Introduction to the Scientific Method

Day 1: Monday, January 5, 2026

Learning Objectives:

- Define the scientific method
- Identify the steps of the scientific method
- Understand the importance of the scientific method in everyday life

Teaching Methodology:

- Direct instruction
- Group discussion
- Interactive presentation

Lesson Planner & Detailed Plan:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Welcome students and introduce the topic of the scientific method
2. Presentation (15 minutes)
 - Use slides 1-3 to introduce the scientific method
 - Engage students with questions about their prior knowledge
3. Group Discussion (10 minutes)
 - Divide class into small groups
 - Have groups discuss and list everyday situations where they might use the scientific method
4. Share and Reflect (5 minutes)
 - Groups share their ideas with the class
5. Closure (5 minutes)
 - Recap key points and preview next lesson

Activities:

- Group brainstorming: "Where do we use the scientific method in our daily lives?"

Homework:

- Write a paragraph about a time you used problem-solving steps similar to the scientific method

- Encourage students to share personal experiences related to scientific inquiry
- Use relatable examples to make the concept more accessible

- A step-by-step process used by scientists to investigate questions

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Step 1: Ask a Question

- Good questions are specific and can be tested

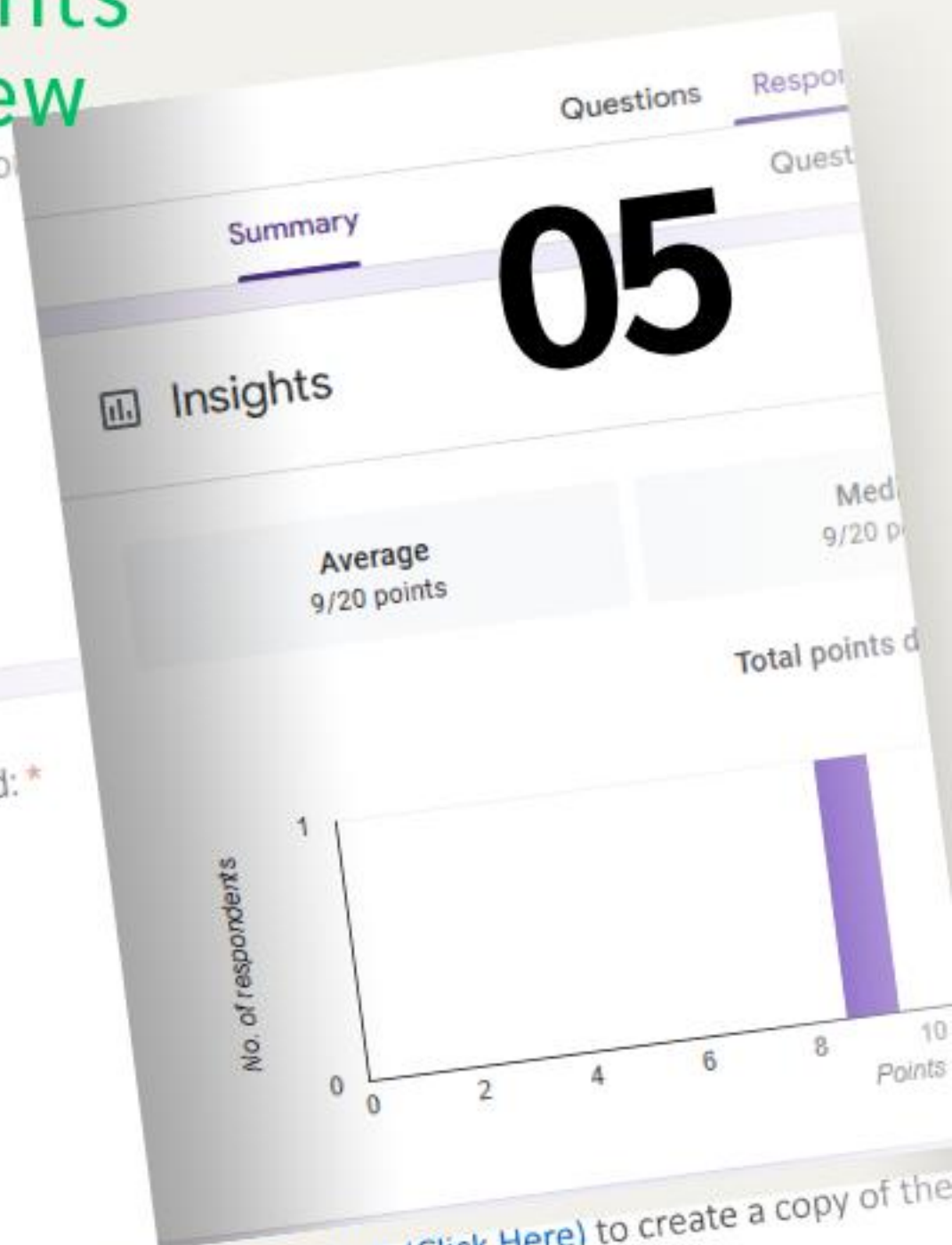

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command, while an exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
