Week 1: Introduction to the Water Cycle

Lesson 1: What is the Water Cycle?

Date: Monday, August 17, 2026

Duration: 40 minutes

Learning Objectives:

- Define the water cycle
- Identify the main stages of the water cycle
- Understand the continuous nature of the water cycle

Teaching Methodology:

- Direct instruction
- Class discussion
- Visual aids (diagrams on the board)

Lesson Planner:

1. Introduction (5 minutes)
 - Ask students what they know about the water cycle
 - Introduce the concept of the water cycle as a continuous process
2. Main Lesson (20 minutes)
 - Define the water cycle
 - Explain the main stages: evaporation, condensation, precipitation, collection
 - Draw a simple diagram on the board
3. Class Activity (10 minutes)
 - In pairs, students create a simple water cycle diagram on paper
4. Wrap-up (5 minutes)
 - Review key points
 - Preview next lesson

Homework:

- Write a paragraph explaining the water cycle in your own words

Tips for Teachers:

- Use simple analogies to explain the continuous nature of the cycle
- Encourage students to share their own observations of water in nature

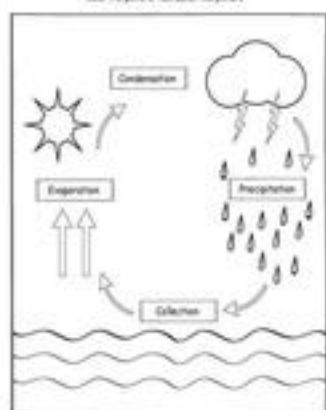

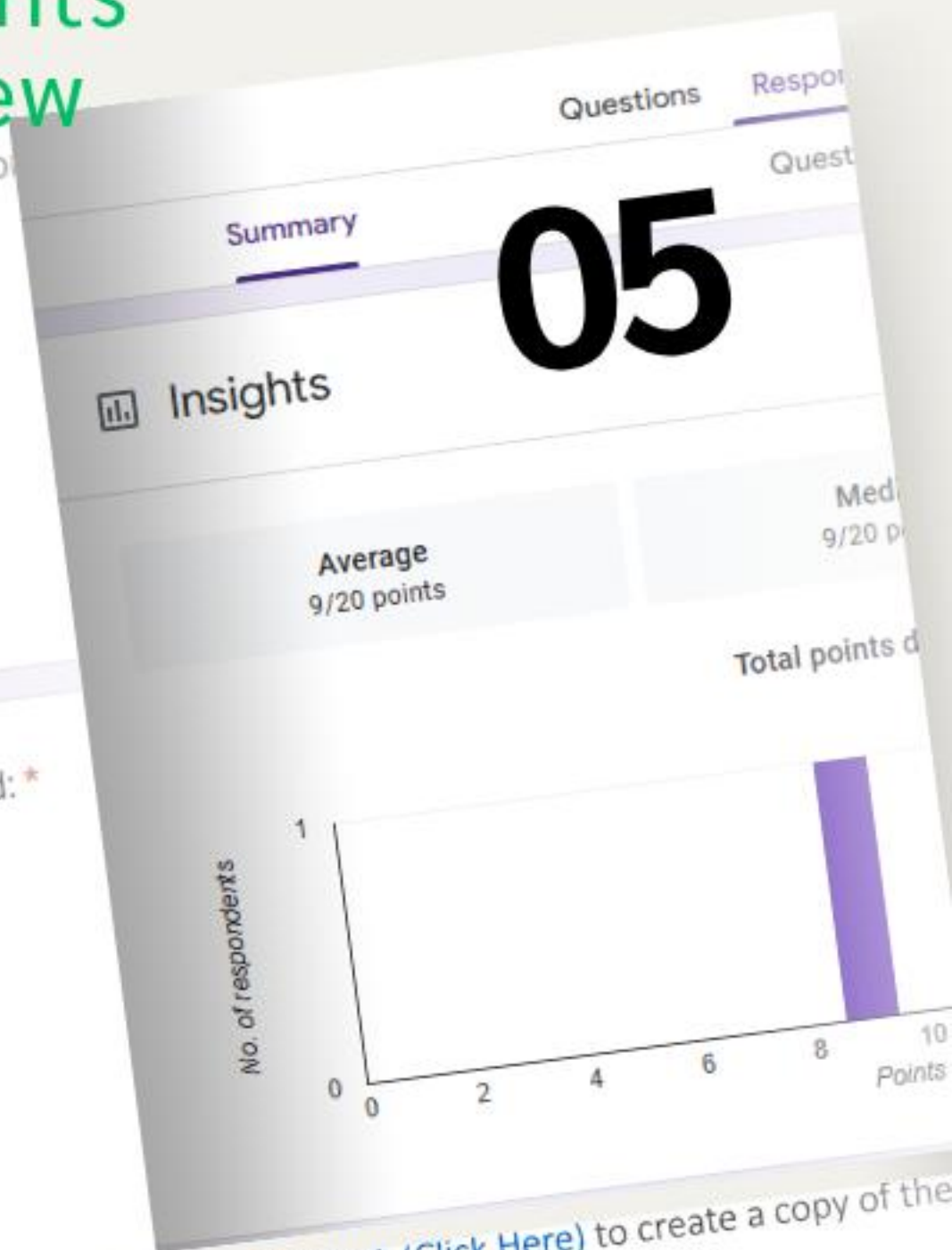

Answer Key

Sample Answer to Question 1

A declarative sentence states a fact or opinion and ends with a period.
Example: "The sky is blue."

Sample Answer to Question 2

To turn a declarative sentence into an interrogative sentence, add a question word or auxiliary verb and end with a question mark.
Example: "The sky is blue." becomes "Is the sky blue?"

Sample Answer to Question 3

The main purpose of an exclamatory sentence is to express strong emotion or excitement.

Sample Answer to Question 4

Common question words: Who, What, Where (also How, When, Why)

Sample Answer to Question 5

A period at the end of an imperative sentence gives it a command. An exclamation point adds urgency or emphasis.
